**April 1 – Egg-stravaganza** Join us for a program that celebrates animals that hatch from eggs! Egg-xamine our nest and egg collections, then hit the trails in search of nests and the rare species of egg laying bunnies (April Fools!)!

April 7 – Water Wonderful World: Join us in exploring our local waterways! Take a hike to the river and learn all about its journey, see what kinds of animals are living in and along its edge, and learn how keeping our local waterways clean can make life better for all that share this earth! All ages welcomed.

April 8 – Living in Water: Discover the hidden world of water insects and polliwogs! Using catch and release activities get a close-up look at amazing little animals that live in our pond and can be found in our local waterways. All ages welcomed.

**April 14 – Wildflower Walk:** Poppies, lupine, and grass pinks! Come explore the Nature Area in search of what's in bloom.



April 15 – Sun Seekers: The weather is warm and so are the reptiles! Slither on in to learn all about these ectotherms (and what that word means!), what kind you may find in our area, and meet a resident reptile up close!

April 21 – Birding for Families: Bring the family out for a birding and nature walk led by a Naturalist and our special guest guides from the Sacramento Audubon Society. Birdwatchers of all levels welcomed. Make sure to bring your binoculars, or we can loan you a pair.

April 22 – Earth Day Walk Take time to appreciate the beauty of Mother Nature this Earth Day with a hike. Join a Naturalist as we explore the variety of local wildlife and plants that call this oak woodland home.

April 28 – Powerful Pollinators Who's responsible for most of the delicious fruits and vegetables we eat? Pollinators! Learn all about the different creature forms pollinators come in, explore some the Nature Center's incredible insect collection, and take a hike to see if you can catch these busy critters in action.

April 29– Save the Frogs Day! Join us in a celebration of some of Mother Nature's most valuable creatures, Frogs! Come see our resident amphibians up close, learn how important they are in the web of life, and how they let us know about the health of our local waterways.
