A Naturalist will guide you into the world of some of the amazing critters that have adapted to life down by the rushing waters of the river.	January 6 – Invasive Invaders At Effie Yeaw we have a few non-native plant and animal species that have taken up residency in the preserve. Learn about the history of a few of these trespassers, their role in the current ecosystem and what people are doing to lessen the issues that come along with these invasive invaders.		
January 12 – Crown of Antlers The bucks are in their winter glory, with beautiful antler crowns. Grab your binoculars to catch a closer look at the black-tailed deer in their habitat and learn more about their world.	January 13 - Hawk Talk Come learn about these amazing raptors that have color vision eight times better than humans. Get a rare close-up look at hawks and learn more about the hawk family.		
January 19 – Birding for Families Bring the family out for a birding and nature walk led by a naturalist and our special guest guides from the Sacramento Audubon Society. Birdwatchers of all levels welcomed. Make sure to bring your binoculars or borrow a pair from us.	January 20– Walk on the Wild Side Winter casts its chilly spell and gives nature its own special winter beauty. Walk with a Naturalist and explore this season in the woodland.
