4 Tree: A Book Reading and Conversation 1:30pm	<div style="border: 2px solid orange; padding: 10px;"> <p style="text-align: center;">The Monarch Butterfly</p> <p>The monarch butterfly may be the most familiar North American butterfly, and is considered an iconic pollinator species. Its wings feature an easily recognizable black, orange, and white pattern. The caterpillars feed exclusively on the milkweed plant. During the fall migration, monarchs cover thousands of miles, with a corresponding multi-generational return north. You can see monarch butterflies and their larvae (caterpillars) at Effie Yeaw Nature Center in the spring! 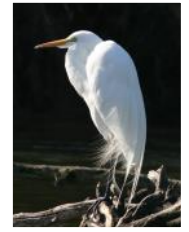
