We recommend arriving 30 minutes prior to start time.



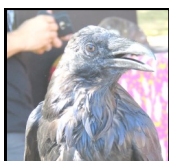
Saturdays – 10:30am	Sundays – 1:30pm
September 2 – Under the Oaks Our mighty oaks provide food and shelter for many animals and insects. Learn how to identify the three species of oak trees found in the Nature Preserve and who may be living in them.	September 3 – Meet the Menagerie Come meet the critters that live at the Nature Center and learn why these animals are not able to return to the wild.
September 9 – Plants with Purpose Come walk with a Naturalist through nature's garden. Learn plant identification and adaptations.	September 10 – Sensational Senses How do humans and animals explore and get information from their environment? Discover the functions of your senses and compare your sensory abilities to local wildlife. Use your senses to investigate animal artifacts and even a live animal!
September 16 – Birding for Families Bring the family out for a birding and nature walk led by a Naturalist and our special guest guides from the Sacramento Audubon Society. 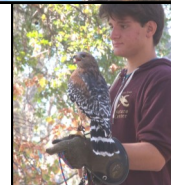
