<p><b>September 1 – Under the Oaks</b> Our mighty oaks provide food and shelter for many animals and insects. Learn how to identify the three species of oak trees found in the Nature Preserve and discover who may be living in them.</p>	<p><b>September 2 – Meet the Menagerie</b> Come meet the critters that live at the Nature Center and learn why these animals are not able to return to the wild.</p>
<p><b>September 8 – Plants with Purpose</b> Come walk with a Naturalist through nature's garden. Learn plant identification and adaptations.</p>	<p><b>September 9 – Sensational Senses</b> How do humans and animals explore and get information from their environment? Discover the functions of your senses and compare your sensory abilities to local wildlife. Use your senses to investigate animal artifacts and even a live animal!</p>
<p><b>September 15 – Birding for Families</b> Bring the family out for a birding and nature walk led by a Naturalist and our special guest guides from the Sacramento Audubon Society. Birdwatchers of all levels welcomed. Make sure to bring your binoculars, or we can loan you a pair.</p>	<p><b>September 16 – Sun Seekers</b> Some have scaly skin, some have slimy skin, some have legs, some don't. Can you guess what they are? Join us and meet one of these cold blooded critters up close!</p>
<p><b>September 22 – Galls for Fall!</b> Join a naturalist for a walk in the nature preserve to explore those inventive insects who build their homes in plants.</p>	<p><b>September 23 – Sea Otter Awareness Week!</b> Let's celebrate otters by highlighting our own local species, river otters! Learn about these secretive and playful creatures and compare them with their ocean cousins. Touch an otter pelt and skull, play otter trivia, and learn how you can help by participating in otter citizen science.
